Chairman McCurdy called for a *Motion to Approve the Consent Agenda*. Trustee Bullington so moved, seconded by Trustee Hile.

DISCUSSION

The Board briefly commented on items in the Consent Agenda.

NEW BUSINESS

Recommendation for ReMix Software Contract Renewal

General Manager Thorne introduced the *Recommendation* to the Board by stating that Remix software is used by staff to plan routes and establish daily work schedules for bus operators. The 3-year contract cost is \$55,500 for three (3) years which would begin January 1, 2020 and expire December 31, 2022; paid from the operating budget. Cost is slightly higher from previous years.

Chairman McCurdy asked the Board for a *Motion to Approve Recommendation for ReMix Software Contract Renewal* moved by Trustee Buchanan, seconded by Trustee Bullington.

The Recommendation for ReMix Software Contract Renewal was approved by the Board.

Recommendation to Delay Fixed Route and Connect Mobility Fare Increases to July 1, 2020

General Manager Thorne introduced the *Recommendation* to the Board by stating that in a prior meeting the Board of Trustees approved a fare increase for Fixed Route and Connect Mobility to take effect on October 1 of 2019.

This *Recommendation* to delay the fare increase to July 1, 2020 will decrease fare revenue an estimated \$45,950 for the period January 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020; and will decrease fare revenue an estimated \$91,900 for the period July 1, 2019 to June 30, 2020. Connect will use additional Federal grant funding in FY2020 in an estimated amount of \$91,900 to balance the budget. The General Manager asked the Board to delay this increase by waiting on the final recommendations from *Connect to the Future Working Group* before moving forward with any increases in fixed route and Connect Mobility fares.

Chairman McCurdy asked the Board for a Motion on the *Recommendation to Delay Fixed Route and Connect Mobility Fare Increases to July 1, 2020.*

Motion to Approve the Recommendation to Delay Fixed Route and Connect Mobility Fare Increases to July 1, 2020, moved by Trustee Hile, seconded by Trustee Bowman.

AYE: All. NAY: None.

The Recommendation to Delay Fixed Route and Connect Mobility Fare Increases to July 1, 2020 was approved by the Board.

<u>Universal Access Agreement with Illinois State University – 6-Month Extension</u>

General Manager Thorne asked the Board to extend Connect Transit's agreement with Illinois State University under the *Universal Access Agreement* for a period of six (6) months (January 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020). For the period of January 1, 2020 to June 30, 2020, the contract amount will be set at \$277,950 and Connect and ISU will continue meeting to discuss the cost structure of the FY2021 contract.

The *Universal Access Agreement* allows Illinois State University students, faculty and staff, to ride Connect Transit fixed route buses free of charge when swiping a valid ISU identification card. Connect has been providing universal access to ISU since 2006.

Chairman McCurdy moved that the *Motion* on the floor be amended by modifying the extension granted would be a period of three (3) months; adding that a period of six (6) months is an unreasonable amount of time for Connect Transit at this juncture. Chairman McCurdy also asked that the *Motion* also be modified by recommending that Illinois State University Board of Trustees approve a retroactive payment to Connect for the period January 1, 2020 through March 31, 2020, for an amount as agreed upon. Chairman McCurdy added he did not want Connect Transit receiving payments that are inadequate for the service ISU receives, keeping in mind that Connect's negotiations with ISU have been on-going for twelve (12) months.

AMENDED MOTION: Recommendation to Approve a Three (3) Month Extension to ISU with ISU retroactively paying to Connect effective January 1, 2020 in an amount determined and agreed upon by both parties.

Trustee Bullington seconded the Motion, as amended.

DISCUSSION

Trustee Whitehouse commented that it was his understanding that negotiations have come to a stalemate with no compromise. With Connect's upcoming budget shortfalls and current issues in the

community, ISU does not want to pay its fair share. Connect cannot afford to continue with extensions and as a Board Member he feels it is time to stand fast.

General Manager Thorne stated that if the original *Recommendation* and/or the *Amended Motion* fail, ISU will not have service as of January 1st.

Chairman McCurdy stated that amounts to 617,000 rides for ISU students annually.

Trustee Whitehouse stated that ridership numbers are important but at what cost? Connect Transit will then be subsidizing to run the service for ISU and why should Connect Transit suffer?

Trustee Bowman asked what about the cost to run the Redbird service?

General Manager Thorne stated that in order to receive any reimbursement from IDOT, Connect must have expenses. If a decision is made that Connect does not want to run ISU service, it is technically "a wash" to some degree but Connect then loses the IDOT money for expenses it is paying to fund its service.

Trustee Whitehouse stated that if the Redbird Express costs \$650,000 to run the service, if Connect chooses not to run that service it will not have that expense. To him it is a wash of revenue and expenses. The ridership bothers him but at the same time he does not think that Connect should subsidize another system – we are providing services and ISU is taking advantage of Connect Transit.

Trustee Buchanan did not disagree with the comments at this point. She believed Connect has found itself between a rock and a hard place. Continuing, she stated that as Board Members, we know Connect provides a good service and believes it is appreciated but eventually the Board is going to have to make a hard decision; reminding all of us that the Board did put in place the Working Group earlier this year to include a look at this very issue. She felt that it is very appropriate and timely to say to the Working Group: we will in fact wait for your recommendations. Discussions have been good and some have not been productive; however, if we undercut one of our base vendors Connect looks to for funding of the overall system, ISU should be very much aware of this conversation tonight. If there is a way or opportunity to cover the cost, then we must negotiate with a very strong partner in our community and she would not be in favor of the *Motion* as amended by the Chairman.

Trustee Whitehouse stated that he does not believe the Working Group was charged with negotiating what ISU is going to pay Connect. They are looking at fares but ISU is not even paying what the costs are so the Working Group, to him, he does not look to them to give advice on how Connect is going to negotiate with ISU.

Trustee Buchanan responded to Trustee Whitehouse by affirming that the Working Group is not is charge of negotiating nor did she think the Working Group wants to be involved in that; however, she did think that the Working Group was to look at very seriously how Connect is funding the system and how does it ensure that we can retain where we are now and where we can improve funding, they are

to weigh in on those ideas. The Working Group is very much aware of the situation and a member of the ISU Leadership Department has been a part of these conversations.

Trustee Bowman asked what are the costs - statements have been made that ISU is not covering the costs with what they are paying. The Financial Statement states ISU is paying an annual contribution of \$559,000, which is the largest single vendor who is participating in the system.

General Manager Thorne stated Connect Transit provides 6,500 hours of service for Redbird Express: roughly \$650,000. All the other rides that are taking place outside of the Redbird, technically are rolled into the Redbird Express route.

Trustee Bowman stated that taking ISU's payment of \$559,000 and multiply that by the DOAP amount, calculates to over \$1M of revenue brought in by ISU when factoring in the IDOT money. He believes ISU wants recognition of that and has always been a negotiating point from the ISU side.
